This survey is designed to capture the views of adult Tanzanians on the major trends in the country that affect their lives, including government social and economic policies. The sampling unit is **adults aged 25 and above**, <u>not</u> household heads (though they may be selected). The questionnaire contains a set of core modules that the selected adult will complete. There are separate modules for 15-24 year olds ('youth'), and for those aged 60 and above ('the elderly').

Memorise and recite the following to the household member or members you meet. If you first meet children, ask to talk to an adult. If there are no adults at home, ask when they will be back. Note the time, and say you will return at that time. If you meet an adult, proceed as follows:

Good day! My name is ______. I work for REPOA, a non-government research organisation based in Dar es Salaam.
