- (A) Fundamentals for research
 - Data for research on industrialization: Collection, Archiving and Analysis
 - Ground proofing international articulation of industrialization pathways

Basis for Evidence Based Policy

- (B) The Political Economy of Industrialization
 - Policy making is policy process politics has to be understood by technocrats
 - Industrialization has a political economy dimension
 - State intervention has to be qualified: what is the 'good' and what is 'bad'?

Sustaining Democracy, Stable and Stability

- (C)Governance and Resource Management In a Broader Context
 - Context Relevant Mitigation Measures against potential resource curse
 - Take stock of ongoing research and fill gaps e.g. Tanzania as a Petrostate has governance
 - Incentivizes, skills and knowledge to lure investments local and international
 - Systems that encourage investment at the same time avoid abuses

- (D) Thematic Topics: Industrialization Models
 - Deeper analyses of Tanzania's Comparative Advantages [& Competitiveness thereafter]
 - Defining and contextualizing the concepts for Tanzania's case
 - Sharing a common understanding of CA avoid conflicting initiatives
 - Mechanisms for building competitive advantages and the evolution
 - Industry: Import substitution v/s export driven industrialization
 - Synchronizing Agriculture Transformation and Industrialization
 - Not only is Agriculture possible an element of where we have a "Comparative Advantage", but also it would also address poverty
 - Research on VC development for industrialization
 - The challenge that industrialization is also urbanization how to manage change
