REPOA scoops top research credentials in Sub-Saharan Africa



REPOA has for the fifth consecutive time been ranked the top most research institution in Tanzania, following the Global Go To Think Tanks Index Report of 2018 that have been released by the Think Tanks and Civil Societies Program (TTCSP) of the Lauder Institute at the University of Pennsylvania of the United States.

The results have revealed that REPOA is ranked at number 11 in Sub-Saharan Africa out of more than 635 Think Tanks that had participated in the exercise. Last year, REPOA was ranked at 12.

Speaking during the event, the Executive

Director Dr. Donald Mmari said that REPOA generates evidence based-policy frameworks that enable the government to plan effectively and design interventions that accelerate economic growth and socio-economic transformation for inclusive development.

This year's Go To Think Tank Index Launch marked the tenth annual event organized by the Think Tanks and Civil Societies Program (TTCSP) to acknowledge the important contributions of think tanks worldwide. This year's theme was Why Think Tanks and Facts Matter for Programs was commemorated at REPOA and drew participants from Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), academia, research institutions, Civil Society Organizations, representatives from the government and the development partners. The 2017 Global Go To Think Tank Index Report, listed 7,815 think tanks around the world, of 7,815 which, equivalent to 8.5% are based in Sub-Sahara Africa i.e., 665 think tanks. In 2017, REPOA was ranked as the top Think Tank in Tanzania and 12th in Sub-Saharan Africa. Swedish Ambassador nods on Women empowerment



Swedish Ambassador to Tanzania, H.E. Anders Sjöberg, has commended on the efforts to empower women through the use of cash transfers. The project on cash transfer which was implemented by TASAF in collaboration with REPOA had its findings unveiled in Dodoma recently.

Speaking at the dissemination of the findings on the Impact of Cash Transfers on Women's Empowerment in Tanzania, H.E Sjöberg said that puts priority on promoting women empowerment through 3Rs (Representation, Resources and Rights). He said that women empowerment would accelerate economic development and promote confidence among women in Tanzania. He called for the reliance on

Speaking at the launch of the event Dr. Mary Mwanjelwa, Deputy Minister in the President's Office responsible for Good Governance said that gender equity is a cornerstone of the Government's long-term development strategy. This, she said, has uplifted many women who have gained confidence to be proactive in decision making starting from household level.
