Launching AGRA's Policy Hub for Tanzania



On August 15th, 2011, the Tanzanian Policy Hub for Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA) was launched at the Movenpick Hotel in Dar es Salaam.

REPOA was selected to host a Hub for the Policy initiative supported by AGRA. The hub initiative aims at strengthening policy research design and implementation and policy support systems to enhance productivity in agriculture

and the entire agricultural product value chain for staple food crops in Tanzania. AGRA has similar initiatives in three other Sub-Saharan African countries; Ghana, Mali and Mozambique.

In 2010, AGRA prepared a Business Plan for a policy initiative in Tanzania to support the implementation of policy advocacy interventions. The plan was based on a comprehensive audit of national agricultural policy and advocacy institutions, assessments of institutional and human capacities, identification of policy advocacy points of entry and recognizing the need to build synergies with on-going national and regional policy efforts.

For REPOA, this programme is consistent with our research programme on growth and development for inclusive growth whereby agriculture and rural transformation is a large component. The program aims to help build capacities for evidence-based policy making and implementation in the areas of seed, soil health, markets, land and environment, and climate change. Five policy action nodes were created for each area.



As the Tanzanian Policy Hub, REPOA will be coordinating the activities of the policy action nodes. Each node is hosted at an existing policy institution with technical expertise in the respective area. The hub will also maintain a National Policy Advisory Committee (NPAC) composed of six members and chaired by the Ministry of Agriculture, Food Security and Cooperatives) for providing technical advice to the implementation of nodes' activities.
